AGENDA ITEM NO. 3

Subject: Rough cost estimate for providing and fixing 60mm thick paver blocks on berms of V-6 road opposite H.No.3537 to 5881 in Rehabilitation Colony, Sector-56, Chandigarh.

(Rs.40.03 lac)

Sh.Darshan Kumar Garg, Senior Deputy Mayor-cum- Area Councillor, Ward No. 11 requested to the Chief Engineer, Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh vide his letter dated 24.03.2012 for providing and fixing of 60 mm thick paver blocks along V-6 road berms in Rehabilitation colony, Sector 56, Chandigarh to facilitate the residents for smooth flow of traffic and parking of vehicles. This providing and fixing of paver blocks on road berms will also protect encroachments on the road berms generally made by the house owners in Rehabilitation Colonies.

Accordingly, the rough cost estimate amounting to **Rs.40.03 lacs** with the following scope of the work has been framed:

1. Earth work in excavation and dismantling of exist cement concrete flooring.
2. Deduct for disposed soil.
3. Carriage of earth by mechanical transport including loading, unloading.
4. Preparation of sub grade.
5. Providing and laying cement concrete 1:8:16.
6. Fixing of new/old PCC kerbs and channels.
7. Providing and fixing PCC kerbs of size 2'-0"x9" having 4" thickness.
8. Providing and fixing PCC channels of size 2'-0"x1 having 3" thickness.
9. Providing and fixing 60 mm thick paver blocks over 20-30 mm taken on both sides of road.

The expenditure on this work will be charged under Head "**4217 (P) Roads and Bridges.**" The budget estimates, budget allocation, amount of already approved estimates and expenditure under this head for Roads Division No.3 is as under:-

Subject: Rough cost estimate for providing and laying 25mm thick SDBC on market in Sector-24, Chandigarh.

(Rs.47.30 lac)

The site was inspected by Executive Engineer, Roads Division No.3, along with Sub Divisional Engineer concerned and it is found that patch work does not serve the purpose of remain good riding quality. The alligator cracks have been noticed on the surface. The road was last carpeted in the year 2007 and is due for renewal coat as per policy of Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh.

Accordingly, the rough cost estimate amounting to **Rs.47.30 lacs** with the following scope of the work has been framed. The scope of the work entered in the estimate does not include in any earlier approved estimate.

1. Dismantling of existing kerbs and channels.
2. Refixing of old kerbs and channels.
3. Providing and fixing of new PCC kerbs and channels.
4. Providing and applying tack coat.
5. Providing and laying 25 mm thick SDBC.

The expenditure on this work will be charged under Head “**4217 (P) Roads and Bridges.**” The budget estimates, budget allocation, amount of already approved estimates and expenditure under this head for Roads Division No.3 is as under:-

Subject: Rough cost estimate for recarpetting of Himalya Marg on V-3 road Uttar marg to Madhya Marg dividing Sector 4/5 and 8/9, Chandigarh.

(Rs.122.67 lac)

The V-3 roads between Sector 4 & 5, 8&9 were recently transferred to Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh vide Secretary Engineering, Chandigarh Administration, Chandigarh office order No. 179 dated 07.03.2011. These roads were last carpetted in July, 2006 and are due for re-carpetting in July 2011 as per policy of Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh. These roads are in bad condition and needs carpeting. 40 mm thick Bituminous Concrete on V-3 road and 50 mm Bituminous Macadam for patch work has been taken in estimate.

Accordingly, the rough cost estimate amounting to Rs.**122.67 lacs** with the following scope of the work has been framed. The scope of the work entered in the estimate does not include in any earlier approved estimate.

1. Dismantling of existing kerbs and channels.
2. Providing and laying tack coat 3 kg/10 sqm. and 2.5 kg/10 sqm.
3. Providing and laying 50 mm B.M.
4. Providing and laying 40 mm Bituminous Concrete.
5. Fixing of dismantled PCC kerbs and channels.
6. Providing and fixing PCC kerbs of size 2'-0"x9"x4".
7. Providing and fixing PCC kerbs of size 1'-0"x1'-0"x4".
8. Providing and fixing PCC channels of size 2'-0"x1'-0"x3".

The expenditure on this work will be charged under Head "**4217 (P) Roads and Bridges.**" The budget estimates, budget allocation, amount of already approved estimates and expenditure under this head for Roads Division No.3 is as under:-

Subject: Estimate for the work of “Supplying, laying, Commissioning and testing of DI sluice valves and motor driven actuator at various RD’s on existing PSC/MS pipe line against augmentation water works scheme phase-III, Chandigarh form water works, Kajauli (Pb.) to water works, Sector-39, Chandigarh.

Water supply system in city Chandigarh is based on deep tubewells as well as on canal water. The water supply of the city was primarily based on tubewells but due to rapid depletion in the water table and increase in the demand of water, the water supply system was augmented by drawing raw water from Bhakra Main Canal running at a distance of 27.4 kms from the Chandigarh. After tapping water from Bhakra main canal it is collected at water works Kajauli in Punjab from where it is pumped to water works near sector 39, Chandigarh. The raw water received from Bhakra main line is filtered at water works sector 39 and pumped to various water works in the city for further supply to water supply distribution network system. The Augmentation water supply scheme for Chandigarh was completed in different phases. The phase-I, II, & IV, Chandigarh have been completed and commissioned by Punjab Water Supply & Sanitation Deptt and phase-III of the scheme was completed and commissioned by Engg. Deptt., Chandigarh Administration during year 1994.

These sluice valves have been installed on the 3rd Phase pipe line from water works, Kajauli to water works, Sector-39, Chandigarh which was commissioned in the year 1994 and being maintained by Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh. The existing sluice valves 800mm i/d have been become non-functional unserviceable. Moreover, efficient functioning of these valves is very much necessary for the smooth functioning of 3rd Phase. As and when there is some break down/leakage in the pipe line the stretch of pipe line which requires repair has to be emptied and this requires a lot of time if these valves are not functional which results in less receipt of raw water from Kajauli and ultimately affects the water supply of the city Chandigarh. As such there is urgent need for replacement of old sluice valves with the new ones of the reputed make for efficient management of Phase-III water supply. As the supply of raw water is very essential so that it is proposed to replace the existing CI sluice Valves with the new ones of superior quality valves i.e ductile iron valves at various RDs along with one no. actuator at RD 0.00 and 4 No. gear boxes at different RDs. It is proposed to dismantle the existing old C.I. sluice valves of 800 mm i/d and to provide and install 5 no. new superior quality valves i.e. Ductile Iron sluice valves of 800mm dia at various locations from water works Kajauli to water works, Sector-39, Chandigarh to ensure better and un-interrupted supply of raw water to Chandigarh. The provision for one No. Actuator at RD 0.00 mtr has been made in the estimate, however for other RDs, due to non-availability of electricity power, the provision for gear boxes has been made. The 5 no.

dismantling joints are required to fix the sluice valves and the provision of the same has been made in the estimate.

The suitable credit for old CI sluice valves proposed to be dismantled has been considered in the estimate. Therefore the estimate duly checked for **Rs. 115.22 Lacs** has been allowed by the competent authority to be placed before the General House of Municipal Corporation for consideration and approval.

Accordingly the agenda is hereby placed before the House of Municipal Corporation. The expenditure will be charged to head: 4215 – Capital Outlay (plan) - Laying of Additional pipe lines and more funds will be demanded in RBE. However the detail of Budget allocation is as under:

Subject: Estimate for the work of “Repair, Strengthening & Testing of existing 6 MG capacity S&S Tank No.2 at Sector 39, Water works, U.T., Chandigarh.

Water supply system in city Chandigarh is based on deep tubewells as well as on canal water. The water supply of the city was primarily based on tubewells but due to rapid depletion in the water table and increase in the demand of water, the water supply system was augmented by drawing raw water from Bhakra Main Canal running at a distance of 27.4 kms from the Chandigarh. After tapping water from Bhakra main canal it is collected at water works Kajauli in Punjab from where it is pumped to water works near sector 39, Chandigarh. The raw water received from Bhakra main line is filtered at water works sector 39 and pumped to various water works in the city for further supply to water supply distribution network system. At present, 20 MGD water is produced by 210 Numbers of tube wells and 80 MGD water is received from Bhakra Canal, through Kajauli water works, in four phases of 20 MGD each. The Kajauli water works is the mother water works of the entire Chandigarh. Out of 80 MGD water, 10 MGD is supplied to Mohali, 3 MGD to Chandimandir & the remaining 67 MGD to Chandigarh. The water after storage & sedimentation is filtered at Sector -39 Chandigarh. The water from Sector 39 Water works is pumped to all other water works located in sectors 12, 37, 52, 26, 32 etc which act as intermediate pumping stations for supplying the chlorinated water to their localized areas / zones.

It is proposed to repair & strengthening of existing 6 MG capacity Storage & Sedimentation Tank No 2 at Sector 39 water works, U.T. Chandigarh. This S&S tank receives raw water from Kajauli Water Works. Raw water is being stored in this tank before treatment and supply. This tank was constructed in Year 1987 by Project Public Health wing of Chandigarh Administration. The specifications adopted for this S&S tank were as under (as reported by department officials) :-

1. PCC over lean concrete in beds.
2. PCC in side slopes
3. RCC in side slopes, flat surface and vertical wall
4. Brickwork in vertical wall

Now with passage of time, this tank has developed longitudinal cracks as well as vertical cracks on the sloping area. The ground water table in year 1987 was at a depth of approximately 3.0 metres below N.G.L. which has now been risen upto a depth of 1.5 metres in the area. Due to rise of water table, uplift pressure on the tank got increased and hence, cracks were developed in the tank. Also, no continuous reinforcement is present in bottom half of sloping area of the tank which is also a cause of vertical and

longitudinal cracks. Due to these cracks lot of water is being wasted through leakage. To save the water and to save the adjoining structures in the vicinity of this tank, it is necessary to frame this estimate for the repair & strengthening of the existing 6 MG capacity S&S Tank No 2 at Sector 39 water works, U.T. Chandigarh.

Therefore the estimate duly checked for **Rs. 226.98 Lacs** has been allowed by the competent authority to be placed before the General House of Municipal Corporation for consideration and approval.

Accordingly the agenda is hereby placed before the House of Municipal Corporation. The expenditure will be charged to head: 4215 – Water Supply & Sanitation (P) – Renovation of Civil works and more funds will be demanded in RBE. However the detail of Budget allocation is as under:

Subject: Estimate for the work of “Supplying, Erection, Testing and Commissioning of new horizontal single stage pump with squirrel cage induction motor 335 KW/980 RPM with soft starter at bed no.9 and supplying, erection, testing and commissioning of new primer mover (Squirrel cage induction motor 355KW/980 RPM with soft starter at bed no.8 and all other work contingent work at Water works, Sector-32, Chandigarh.

Water supply system in city Chandigarh is based on deep t/wells as well as canal water. The water supply of the city was primarily based on t/well but due to rapid depletion in the water table and increase in the demand of water, the water supply system was augmented by drawing raw water from Bhakra Main Canal running at distance of 27.4 KM from the Chandigarh. After tapping water from Bhakra main canal it is collected at water works Kajauli in Punjab from where it is pumped to water works near sector 39 Chandigarh. The raw water received from Bhakra main line is filtered at water works sec 39, Chd and is being pumped at various water works in the city located at Sec 12,26,32 & 37 for further supply to water supply distribution network system covered by under zones of respective water works.

Water works Sec 32 feeds clear water to Sector 20 C&D, 21 C&D, partially to Sector 29, Sector 30,31,32,33,34, I/A Phase-I, Sec 44,45,46,47, Burail, Colony No 5 etc and also to water works sec 26 and Manimajra Chd. At present 11 Nos pumping set are installed for pumping clear water to the areas covered under this water works. The existing motor at bed No. 8 and complete pump set installed at bed No 9 which were installed in the year 1988 have worn out due to continuous use. This motor and pump set has become uneconomical to operate as the efficiency of motor and pump set has gone down and thus is not capable to deliver rated discharge at required head. The repair of machinery is also uneconomical because the machinery has outlived its life as per norms.

It is proposed to replace the electric motor at bed No. 8 & old pump set with prime mover with new horizontal single stage pump capable to deliver 2044m³/hrs at head 46 mtr & squirrel cage motor 335 KW/980 RPM. The new pump set will have the same parameters so that the foundation and other fitting (except NRV, Taper, MS bend) can be utilized for new sets. The existing pumping OCB/water type regulators installed at bed No. 8 & 9 are proposed to be replaced with the latest technology based Soft starters. The new pump set will be suitable to deliver the rated discharge. In addition to the pump set, NRV size 500mm is also proposed to be replaced at bed No 8 & 9 at water works sec. 32, Chandigarh as the NRV is not working properly and outlived its life due to wear and tear. The suitable credit for old pump set, NRV's, MS taper and bend proposed to be dismantled has been considered in the estimate. Thus the estimate for replacement

of 1 No electric motor & 1 No pump set complete with prime mover amounting to Rs. 69.53 Lacs including 3% contingency and PE charges is being submitted for administrative approval by the competent authority.

Accordingly the agenda is hereby placed before the House of Municipal Corporation. The expenditure will be charged to head: 4215 – C.O.L. (P) Urban Water Supply & Sanitation - Replacement of pumping machinery and more funds will be demanded in RBE. However the detail of Budget allocation is as under:

Subject: - Recarpeting of Udhyan Path V-3 Road (Uttar Marg to Madhya Marg) Dividing Sector 2/3 & 10/11, Chandigarh.

(Approx. Amount: - Rs.136.43 lacs)

The V-3 Road (Udyan Path) dividing Sector 2/3 and Sector 10/11, Chandigarh was recently transferred to Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh from the Chandigarh Administration. It is pertinent to mention that as per record, this road was lastly carpeted in July 2006 and as per policy of Municipal Corporation, the recarpeting is to be done after 5 years, which was due for recarpeting during this year. This road was inspected by the Executive Engineer, Roads Division No.3 alongwith Sub Divisional Engineer, Roads Division No.3, M.C and it has been observed that lot of cracks and pot holes have been developed on the road surface, causing inconvenience to the public. Accordingly a rough cost estimate amounting to Rs.136.43 lacs has been prepared for arranging administrative approval and allotment of funds. The scope of the work entered in the estimate does not include in any earlier approved estimate. The estimate includes the following scope of works.

1. Dismantling/refixing of existing kerbs and channels.
2. P/L Tack Coat 3kg/10 sqm.
3. P/1 40mm thick Bituminous Concrete

The expenditure on this work shall be charged under Head “4217 (P) Improvement of Roads and Parkings and infrastructure facilities”. The budget allocation cost of already approved estimate and expenditure incurred under this head is as under:

Subject: - RCE for the work of upgradation of water works-cum-boasting station (Ph.II), Sector 52, Chandigarh.

(Rs.1548.00 lacs)

Water supply system in city Chandigarh is based on deep tubewells as well as on canal water. The water supply of the city was primarily based on tubewells but due to rapid depletion in the water table and increase in the demand of water, the water supply system was augmented by drawing raw water from Bhakra Main Canal running at a distance of 27.4 kms from the Chandigarh. After tapping water from Bhakra main canal it is collected at water works Kajauli in Punjab from where it is pumped to water works near sector 39, Chandigarh. The Kajauli water works is the mother of water works of entire Chandigarh. The water after storage and sedimentation is filtered at water works, Sector-39, Chandigarh. The water after filtration is chlorinated. The water from Sector-39 water works is pumped to all the water works located in Sec-12, 26, 32, 37 & 52, which act as intermediate Pumping Stations for supplying the chlorinated water to their localized area/zones. The proposed estimate has been prepared for Augmentation of existing water works-cum-Boosting station at water works, Sec-52, Chandigarh. Presently Phase-I is under operation and supplying water to Sec-48 to 52, Chandigarh. At the time of planning of water works Phase-I, provision of Phase-II was kept for supplying water to Sec-53 to 56, Chandigarh which were not developed at that time. Now these sectors are rapidly developing and population in these sectors is increasing at fast pace. Hence the augmentation of water works-cum-boasting station at Sec-52, Chandigarh is required to meet up the demand of these sectors. At present the following units exists under Phase-I at water works-cum-Boosting station, Sec-52, Chd:-

- (i) Clear water tanks – 2 No. each of 2MG capacity.
- (ii) Suction sump – 1 No of 35000 gallons capacity.
- (iii) Pump House – suitable for installation of pumps under Phase-I as well as Phase-II
- (iv) Panel Room – suitable for installation of HT & LT panels under Phase-I as well as Phase-II

Under Phase-II, it is proposed to construct 2 No. clear water tanks each of capacity 2MG alongwith suction sump of 35000 gallons capacity. Further, 3 No. Electrical and 2 No. Diesel driven pumps shall be installed in existing Pump House. The provision for HT & LT panels of new machinery alongwith Transformer has been taken in the estimate. The existing pumps are not SCADA compatible and new starters have been proposed to be installed on existing machinery to make Phase-I SCADA compatible. The provision for making phase – II fully SCADA compatible has been made in the estimate. The provision for necessary pipe lines, valves and specials has also been made in the estimate.

Therefore the estimate duly checked for 1548.00 Lacs has been allowed by the competent authority to be placed before the General House of Municipal Corporation for consideration and approval.

Accordingly the agenda is hereby placed before the House of Municipal Corporation. The expenditure will be charged to Head: 4215- (P) Augmentation of city water supply system including Phase V, VI & VII and more funds will be demanded in RBE. However the detail of Budget allocation is as under:

Subject: - Providing and laying 40mm thick Asphaltic Concrete on V-3 Road between Sector 27 & 30, Chandigarh.

(Approx. Amount: - Rs.56.90 lacs)

The V-3 Road between Sector 27 & 30, Chandigarh was recently transferred to Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh from the Chandigarh Administration. It is pertinent to mention that as per record, this road was lastly carpeted in April 2007 and as per policy of Municipal Corporation, the recarpeting is to be done after 5 years, which was due for recarpeting during this year. This road was inspected by the Executive Engineer, Roads Division No.2 alongwith Sub Divisional Engineer, Roads Division No.7, M.C and it has been observed that lot of cracks and pot holes have been developed on the road surface, causing inconvenience to the public. Accordingly a rough cost estimate amounting to Rs.56.90 lacs has been prepared for arranging administrative approval and allotment of funds. The scope of the work entered in the estimate does not include in any earlier approved estimate. The estimate includes the following scope of works.

1. Dismantling of existing kerbs and channels.
2. P/F of new Kerbs and channels.
3. P/K tack coat.
4. P/I 40mm thick Asphaltic Concrete

The expenditure on this work shall be charged under Head “4217 (P) Improvement of Roads and Parkings and infrastructure facilities”. The budget allocation cost of already approved estimate and expenditure incurred under this head is as under:

SUPPLEMENTARY AGENDA ITEM NO. 6

Subject: Review of the construction of Day Market at Charan Singh Colony, Mauli Jagran, Chandigarh.

As per the resolution of the General House in its 164th meeting held on 28.2.2011, a Rough Cost Estimate amounting to Rs.86.44 lacs for the construction of the Day Market at Mauli Jagran, Chandigarh was passed.

The agenda was taken up as item No.11 in the form of Table Agenda. Due to shortage of time no discussion took place for the same. Yet, a detail discussion was required in view of the following issues:-

1. The construction of Day Market site was under Rehabilitation plan and the rehabilitation issue is not within the purview of the Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh. This is dealt by the Chandigarh Administration. Moreover, it mandated a proper policy/procedure for the allotment to be done. Neither any policy was discussed nor it was formulated by the Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh, it being an important issue.
2. After getting the policy formulated for the same it was required to be got approved from the Competent Authority i.e. Chandigarh Administration.
3. The number of persons demanding the sites to be constructed are much more than the number of sites which are to be constructed. In the absence of the concrete plan/policy there is unrent amount the people of the area. Therefore, to avoid any pick & choose and discrimination in the allotment of such sites a proper policy is to be formulated and got approved from the Administration, first.

Apart from it the execution of the work also involves a huge amount of the money, therefore, it will be appropriate to review the decision earlier taken by the Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh.
