AGENDA ITEM NO. 1

Confirmation of the minutes of 189th meeting of the General House held on 30.01.2013 at 11.00 a.m. in the Assembly Hall of the Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh.

The Secretary placed agenda item No.1 before the House for confirmation.

Major D.S.Sandhu (Retd.) pointed out that in the minutes of 189th meeting of the House at page No.15 Sr.No.8, **50% had been typed inadvertently. In fact it should be read as 50.**

Sh. Rajesh Gupta said that during the discussion, he had suggested that Sector Resident Welfare Association should be allowed to hold the meeting free of cost in the Community Centre.

The Commissioner apprised that his suggestion had already been incorporated in the minutes at page No.15 at Sr. No.9.

The Mayor suggested that FOSWAC should also be allowed to hold a meeting free of cost once in a month.

Sh. Arun Sood said that there are so many welfare associations like Housing Board Federation & Sr. Citizens Associations, therefore, these should also be allowed free of cost. He further said that there was a suggestion that the Residents Welfare Associations should be allowed free of cost on the recommendation of the area Councillors.

Major D.S.Sandhu (Retd.) opposed the suggestion regarding the recommendation of area Councillor and said that this issue should not be politically motivated and there is need no recommendation of the area Councillor.

Sh. Des Raj Gupta said that there was no community centre in Sector-26. In spite of best efforts and repeated inspections, the same could not be constructed so far and where the residents of this area would hold the meetings.

Sh. Arun Sood said that he suggested in the previous meeting that the booking of the Community Centre should be through e-sampark and online on the Delhi pattern. He further said that the right of verification for membership should be with the Elected Councillors & not to the Nominated Councillors.

There was din in the House on this issue.

The Mayor said that rights had been given to the Nominated Councillors in the Municipal Act, if the House is not agreeable, an agenda should be brought before the House for any kind of amendment in the Act.

Sh. Arun Sood said that the statement of Mayor had not been recorded regarding the cremation of cows.

The Mayor replied that he had stated that he would not do the cremation of cows in his personal capacity. He further said that the recording could be listened and by group of Councillors and his statement would be recorded accordingly.

Smt. Asha Jaswal said that the reason of postponement of the meeting of House had not been recorded.

Sh. Arun Sood pointed out that at page No.14 at Sr.No.7 of the minutes, **Chairperson** be read as **Vice Chairperson**.

“The House unanimously confirmed the minutes of 189th meeting of the General House held on 30.1.2013 at 11.00 a.m. in the Assembly Hall of the Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh with the above mentioned amendments.”

AGENDA ITEM NO. 2

Budget Estimates for the year 2013-14.

The Secretary placed agenda item No.2 before the House for discussion.

At the outset, the Mayor read out the budget speech and the Councillors of the BJP demanded for zero hour for some important issues and interrupted the budget speech of the Mayor.

The Mayor said that there was no provision for zero hour in the Act. However, on the demand of Councillors, the zero hour was fixed for thirty minutes only, but nobody was following the said provision. He said first of all budget be discussed and then zero hour can be held. There was din in the House on this issue.

The Mayor told, “ the present budget is a realistic budget and has been prepared in view of the suggestions of the members.” He had invited the suggestions from all the Councillors and an appeal was also sent to the public through media for inviting the suggestions. He further said that although few suggestions were received and the same had been kept in view while preparing the budget. Last year, some difficulties were faced by the public, as shortage of water and cleanliness etc. but the condition of city was not bad. According to the survey conducted by a famous

magazine of India, Chandigarh is the 2nd city out of 30 best cities. Thereafter, the Mayor read out the formal budget speech.

Sh. Arun Sood said, “the budget is an important document and there should be healthy discussion on the budget estimates.” He said that more than fifty percent cut on plan side has been proposed. He invited the attention of the House towards Section 86 of the Act and read out the same. According to the provisions of this Act, the budget estimates should be passed by the house in the first week of February and should be finally approved by the Administration within February. He said no prior meeting was held for the discussion on budget. He further said that the receipts of the M.C. was decreasing day per day. The sanitation condition of the city is not good. The contaminated water is being supplied and condition of roads is also bad. An appropriate grant is not being provided by the Finance Commission, which is the right of the Corporation. He further told that Smt. Kamla Sharma was the first Mayor of the city in 1997. She alongwith all the Councillors went to Finance Commission Delhi and twenty percent of the total revenue was allocated to the Corporation. He criticized the budget estimates prepared by the office.

The Mayor said that these were only recommendations, in fact not more than twelve or thirteen percent of the total revenue was allotted to the Corporation.

Sh. Davesh Moudgil said that there was major cut on the plan head, which would affect the development of the city. He further said for increasing the receipts, the Corporation would have to sale its property or encash the FDRs. It would have been better if the budget had already been discussed. He read out the details of the budget

for the previous years as well as for the year 2013-14. He suggested for the detailed discussion on the Plan Head of the budget.

Smt. Harjinder Kaur said that during the year, 2007 being in minority, more grant-in-aid was received from the Administration. The Chandigarh Corporation won the first prize being the cleanliest city of India in the year, 2007. She further suggested that the collective efforts could bring the more grant from the Administration rather than imposing the tax on residents. The major part of the revenue should come to the Corporation. There is no provision for gender budgeting has been made in the budget. She further suggested that prior to construction of Mahila Bhawan, Women Empowerment Committee should be strengthened and atleast provision of Rs. 9.00 Crore be made for Women Education & Health. She further told that in the year, 2007, it was decided that two villages and two colonies would be modernized each year and suggested that it should be continued and we shall cover all the villages and colonies of the city within five years. The House being elected body, our focus should be on the education and health. She also suggested an exclusive meeting should be held for well planning before the end of current year, so that we may follow the said planning in the next year. She invited the attention of the House towards the cremation ground of the city, which was in a bad shape and requires renovation

The Mayor told that like other Committees, he had recommended to assign the power upto Rs.15.00 lac to the Women Empowerment Committee also.

Major D.S.Sandhu (Retd.) thanked the Mayor for making the budget provision for dog pound, but the Corporation should make efforts for acquiring the land

for pound from the Administration. He suggested for the cleanliness of the road gullies before the rainy season through outsourcing. He asked whether any budget provision has been made for sewerage treatment plant at Maloya and further asked about the progress in this regard. He further suggested for 100% recovery of property tax from commercial property, so that the revenue receipt of the Corporation might be increased and collective efforts should be made to obtain the maximum grant in aid from the Administration.

Sh. Pardeep Chhabra said that unfortunately he could not give his suggestions for the present budget and told that the Corporation had been trying for water from Kajauli Water Works since, 2006, but the Government has always refused. Recently, a meeting was held between the officers of Administration and Corporation, vide which it was decided that canal water would be provided to the 13 Villages. He further said that the water level of the city was going down. The dynamic resources are not used properly. He told, "four deep bore tubewells are to be installed having 300 meter depth whereas water upto 50-60 meter is fit for human consumption." There are already about 15 shallow tubewells in the city. Water is the main problem of the city, therefore, we should properly use the dynamic sources such as water, but the said water should be got examined first before consumption. He further suggested that a survey should be got done for multi level parking in the city, such multi level parking have already been proposed by the Corporation. The case of Multi level parking in Sector-22 is pending with the Chief Architect and a token price should be kept for the said parking, so that the problem of parking may be solved. Two swimming pools in Sector-49 & in Sector-39 had already been approved by the House but no budget

provision has been made in the present budget. He told that there was leakage of water and if the said leakage was controlled, the problem of shortage of water would be solved to a great extent. Sector-22 is old sector and there are back service lanes and due to the leakage in these service lanes, the walls of the houses are getting cracks. The said service lanes are very old and requires replacement, so that the wastage of water can be controlled and any kind of accident may be avoided and budget provision may be made for that purpose. The Administration had agreed in principle to provide the grant in aid and land for the stadium of international level, therefore, the matter may be pursued with the Administration. He further said that the major part of tax was paid by the traders of Chandigarh and suggested that there should be a trader bhawan for them. He further suggested for making provision in the budget for community parking in the residential areas and the matter may be taken up with the Chief Architect in this regard.

Sh. Surinder Bahga said, "he does not agree that the budget is realistic because the figures he has collected seem unrealistic. He told that a Committee was constituted for water sources, but no meeting was held by the said Committee. In the estimate of previous years, the cost of a tubewell was shown Rs. 15.00 lac to Rs.20.00 lac but in the present budget, the provision of a tubewell has been made as Rs.10.00 lac.. According to a documentary, the water supply for 24 hours has been made in three cities and it was found that actual consumption of water has reduced in these cities. He further asked about the exact life of a tubewell. A budget provision was made for Rs. 12.00 crore in the budget of previous year for Water Works & boosting station of Sector-52, but the budget provision of Rs.8.00 crore had been made in the

present budget for the same whereas the estimate has been passed for Rs. 15.00 Crore and he said that the figures are unrealistic. He further highlighted the budget provision and estimates for various other projects.

The Mayor replied the queries of Sh. Bahga and told that all the projects were not to be completed within one year, therefore, initial amount was kept in view of the completion of work during financial year. Therefore, the figures of budget and estimates are not same.

Sh. Satish Kainth thanked the Mayor for the realistic budget. He told that there are so many hotels and malls in his ward, Industrial Area, Phase-I. An amount of Rs. 2000 Crore was paid by the traders as conversion charges to the Administration and there was need of beautification of this area. He requested for special budget provisions for providing basic amenities in said area.

Sh. Rajesh Gupta said that the planning of the projects was not proper. The project of multi level parking was taken up in the year, 2007, but the same has not been started so far. Therefore, he suggested that there should be proper & time bound planning of all the projects.

Sh. Harphool Chand Kalyan said that the southern sectors requires more attention. The road gullies of Sector-49, 50 & 51 are not proper, these road gullies have no connectivity. The matter of dispensary was under process which would be handed over to the Corporation in near future.

The House adjourned for lunch break at 2.15 p.m. and re-assembled at 3.10 p.m.

Smt. Gurbax Rawat appreciated the budget estimates for the year, 2013-14. She further described the condition of neighbourhood parks of southern sectors. There is no community parking and sports complex in southern sectors and she requested to earmark special fund from the general head for the community parking and sports complex in southern sectors.

Smt. Heera Negi described the monkey menace and stray dog menace and requested that budget provisions be made for avoiding the monkey & dog menace. She further told that in her area Sector-46, garbage was always littered and demanded that SSKs may be constructed or the garbage may be sent directly to garbage plant.

Sh. Malkiat Singh told that the sewer lines of his area were there at the time of Panchayats and now the pipes had been laid down by the Corporation, which remain always blocked and dirty water flows on the roads, which damaged the roads. He further said that before implementation of the scheme, merits and demerits may be examined properly. The condition of roads, sanitation and street lights is very poor and the quality of the material of roads is very poor.

Smt. Harjinder Kaur asked about the status of tertiary water. She further said that the condition of public toilets in gardens & markets was very bad. She said that due to large number of hotels, the population of dogs and rats had increased tremendously, which was an alarming situation for the plague and policy be made to check this menace. She suggested that by updating the water billing & stoppage of leakage of water, the revenue of the Corporation could be increased. She further

suggested that the recarpetting of V-6 roads should be after four years, community parking & indoor multipurpose stadium should also be constructed.

Smt. Sheela Devi said that the samples of drinking water were obtained from Village Kajheri, which were not found upto the standard. She further said the condition of roads and electricity in her area was also bad and suggested that good quality material should be used for recarpetting of roads and requested for the patch work of the roads.

Sh. Saurabh Joshi criticised that the budget estimates were being passed on the last day of the month. Further, he pointed out the cut in the budget of JNNURM and SJSRY schemes. He told these schemes had been launched for the upliftment of poor, but the people are not aware of the benefits of these schemes. He suggested that the people should be aware about these schemes, so that the deserving youths can avail these facilities. He asserted for the playgrounds in the city.

The Mayor told that SJSRY was not the scheme of Corporation. The Centre Government gives grant under this scheme and the expenditure is incurred according to the grant-in-aid issued by the Central Government and he admitted that the Councillors were also not aware about the scope of this scheme. He said that no one had been refused so far availing the benefit under this scheme provided he fulfills the eligibility criteria because this scheme is only for the BPL families. He further told that the matter relating to stadium had been discussed with the Chief Architect., as and when the land would be provided by the Administration, the budget provision would be made accordingly.

Sh. M.P. Kohli said that major part of the revenue had been going to Punjab in the shape of VAT, Taxes and liquor etc. because there were no big marriage palace in the city and he suggested that 8-10 big marriage palaces should be constructed, which would generate the revenue for the Corporation. He further said that budget provision of Rs. 2.00 crore for Fire & Emergency Services was not sufficient and he suggested for Rs. 10.00 crore budget provision for Fire & Emergency Services. He asserted for imposing the house tax in the city.

“The House considered and resolved by majority that the revised estimates for the current financial year 2012-13 & Budget Estimates for the next financial year, 2013-14 , as per detail given below:-

The Councillors of BJP raised objection on the budget for the year 2013-14, and wanted to discuss the budget more and there was din in the House on this issue. Ultimately, the House was adjourned for 10 minutes at 3.55 p.m. and reassembled at 4.20 p.m.

Sh. Darshan Kumar Garg, Sh. Satish Kainth, Smt. Gurbax Rawat and Smt. Poonam Sharma asked the Mayor that pending agenda be taken up for discussion as a large amount of time of the House was being wasted in non-relevant discussions and development work of city was suffering.

The Mayor asked the Secretary to take up the remaining agenda items of 189th meeting and 190th meeting.

Thereafter Pending Agenda Items No.7 to 20 of the adjourned 189th meeting held on 30.01.2013 were taken.

The Councillors of BJP and Shiromani Akali Dal objected to proceed further before detailed discussion on the budget, but the agenda items were taken one by one and passed by majority.

5. ***To formulate policies regarding modernization of dispensaries making dispensaries environment more health for patients and doctors.***

Primary Education committee

1. ***To sanction works like repair, maintenance and construction upto Rs.15.00 lacs.***
2. ***To Advise regarding: Providing facilities like scholarship, stipend, uniform, text books, lunch box, water bottles, shoes, socks, mid day meal and teaching learning material etc.***
3. ***To advice measures for bringing pupil teacher ratio as per the norms.***

4. **To inspect the MCC schools.**
5. **To formulate policies regarding modernization of schools making schools environment more attractive & friendly for Teacher & Students.**
